

How to use this test:

Note: The first part of this test is NOT designed to be printed and given to students. It suggests questions and tasks to be spoken aloud.

Step 1) Review the test along with the student workbook pages referenced.

Step 2) Decide which questions are best to use with your students, and how many to use.

Advanced classes with strong students could be given the full tests with all questions. Classes that moved more slowly and/or needed extra help could be given fewer questions.

Step 3) Add any additional questions you would like in order to focus on topics your class was especially engaged with.

Directions to Teacher: Hold up Student Workbook page 106 and ask the following questions:
