3.8.1 TOB Relate how the body reveals the person. (TOB 14:4; CCC 364-366, 371)

SUGGESTED TIME

30 minutes

Teacher Background

Every person has an innate and absolute dignity. But why? How do we know this? Christians understand that every person has dignity because he or she is made in the image of God. Because God made us, and because we receive ourselves as a gift from God, Christians are called to uphold the goodness of every person's body as created by God to be treated with dignity. We do so by respecting everyone's bodies, including their sex as male or female as God made them to be.




HOW DOES THIS LESSON HELP INOCULATE STUDENTS AGAINST GENDER IDEOLOGY?


Gender ideology holds that our dignity comes to us externally, from the affirmation of others. But our human dignity is not dependent on affirmation from anyone else. We do not do anything to earn our human dignity, and we cannot do anything to lose it. It can never be taken away from us. God gives each human person dignity, whether or not that person recognizes that reality. And God gives all people their bodies, male and female, and says that they are good — even when we do not recognize our own goodness.

Activity

Note: Before you begin teaching, watch the "Can someone's sex be chosen?" video available at SophiaOnline.org/Transgender

- A. Hold up the picture you brought in and tell the class, "This is Joe [or the person's name]. Look at Joe."
- B. Then pause and say, "Now look at Joe's body." *Pause*. "Now, look at Joe again."








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E. Continue to explain that because God made us, and we receive ourselves as a gift from God. So just as with any gift, there are things about ourselves that we do not choose, such as our eye color, height, or sex. God has, of course, has given us free will

and the ability to determine a lot of things about our lives. Ask for a few volunteers to say some choices we can make about our lives. Our favorite foods, our hobbies, our friends, how we spend our free time, sports we play, and so forth.

- F. Distribute to each student a <u>God-Given or My Choice?</u> Worksheet and make scissors and glue sticks available. Have them cut out the strips, and paste each one in the column in which it belongs.
- **G.** When they have finished, recreate the chart on the board and review the correct answers together by writing them on the board.



- H. Wrap up by explaining the following: Because we are God's creatures, it is important that we accept about ourselves and others the things that God has given as gifts. Many of those gifts are things we cannot change, such as who our parents are, where we were born, and whether we are male or female. Our male or female bodies are a great gift that God has given us, and we ought to be thankful and respectful towards one another's bodies. It can be harder to see our bodies as good when we experience pain, illness, and other maladies. There may be times when we wish our body could be more athletic, graceful, stronger, or otherwise different. We can have faith that at the Resurrection, we will see as God sees, and our bodies will perfectly reveal His love.
- Close by praying together Psalm 139:13-14:

You formed my inmost being; you knit me in my mother's womb. I praise you, because I am wonderfully made; wonderful are your works! My very self you know.

CHRISTIAN ANTHROPOLOGY STANDARDS

3.8.1 TOB Relate how the body reveals the person. (TOB 14:4; CCC 364-366, 371)

SUGGESTED TIME

20 minutes

Teacher Background

God creates each person male or female. Sex is determined at conception, observed in utero or at birth, and never changes. Throughout the plant and animal kingdoms, there are only two sexes. An organism is either male or female, and this is defined by the type of gamete, or reproductive cell, that it produces: sperm or ova. Females produce large-cell gametes, (ova, or egg cells), and males produce small gametes (sperm). There is no third type of gamete, or any other sex.



HOW DOES THIS LESSON HELP INOCULATE STUDENTS AGAINST GENDER IDEOLOGY?


Transgender ideology puts forth that "gender identity" or "gender expression" are self-determined. But the truth is that our body reveals our sex, and that sex is an unchanging, biological fact that is genetically determined and reflected in every cell of the body.

Activity

- A. Begin by talking for a moment about what it means to make a choice. Hold up two different books, plush toys, or other small items, and ask the class which they would choose.
- B. Ask students to raise their hands and share a choice they made today.
- C. After calling on a few students to share, explain the following:
 - a. Some choices have to do with our favorites, or preferences. We might choose to play a board game over a video game, or to ride a bike rather than roller skate.
 - b. We can also make choices about ourselves and we will act. We can choose to be kind to our siblings, or to help someone who needs help.
 - c. We can make choices about how to use our gifts and talents: we can choose to be a soccer player, a violinist, or an artist.
 - d. There are other things about ourselves that we cannot choose, because God chooses them. Some of these include our birthday, whether we have blue, brown, or green eyes, or whether we are a girl or a boy.

- E. Continue to explain that being a girl or being a boy is something very special. It is an important part of who we are. In the beginning, God made human beings male and female. When God made the first man, Adam, He did not want Adam to be alone. He made a helper, or partner, for the man. That was the first woman, Eve. Men and women are equal in dignity, meaning God loves us just as much whether we are a girl or a boy. Girls are not better than boys, and boys are not better than girls. But we are different. When a man and woman unite in marriage, their love creates life. Their differences complement each other, and are a beautiful part of God's design.
- F. Have students complete the first three questions on **Choices I Can Make, and Choices God Makes individually.**
- G. Then read aloud the information on My Body Shows Who I Am. Give students a few moments to draw their pictures and compose their prayers, and ask if anyone would like to share.
- H. Take care NOT to introduce the wrong idea that students should wonder if they are a girl or a boy. However, if a student asks about someone who is identifying as transgender, you could add:

"I know Jane [be sure to use her given name and grammatically-correct pronouns for her sex] from your class is confused about her sex right now. We will pray she and her parents will get through this and that Jane realizes she is wonderful just as God made her to be."








3.2.1 TOB Give examples of man's unique relationship with God as set apart from the rest of creation: naming the animals, cultivating the earth, and choosing between good and evil. (TOB 5:4, 6; CCC 343, 356, 373, 378)

SUGGESTED TIME

20 minutes

Teacher Background

God Himself is an eternal exchange of love between the three Persons, and He has destined His children to share in that love. He created men and women in His image and likeness, set them apart from the rest of creation, and gave them special privileges and responsibilities. Created in God's image, man is thus also created for this communal exchange of love. This exchange of love occurs with all persons in the human family, and, in a particular way, within the context of the family, where the love of a husband and wife is manifested in the begetting of children.



HOW DOES THIS LESSON HELP INOCULATE STUDENTS AGAINST GENDER IDEOLOGY?

Gender ideology asserts that our bodies are tools for self-expression, and that they can be manipulated and controlled. But students will learn the truth is that their body is part of who they are. God loves them, and God loves their body. We all have the duty to lovingly care for creation, so life may flourish.

Activity

- A. Explain the following to your students: God created men and women in His image, set apart from the rest of creation. Only human beings are made in God's image and likeness. Human beings alone can know and love our creator. We can see this very special and unique relationship of love that God has with mankind from the very beginning. God gave Adam and Eve the important privilege and responsibility of naming the animals, and cultivating the earth. Cultivating the earth means caring for it, so that it will bring forth the things we need to live, such as plants and animals. In this way, Adam and Eve would cooperate with God and each other in nurturing life and all the gifts of creation.
- B. Optional: If you have them available, spread out a selection of small animal dolls, such as small plush toys or plastic figures, and arrange them with the dolls, Adam and Eve,
 - in the center. Then explain that by setting them apart, it means that God said they were special. They were different from all the animals. And they would be treated differently because of their special nature.
- C. Distribute the <u>Set Apart</u> worksheet to your students. Read aloud <u>Genesis 1:27–28</u> and ask if anyone noticed anything in the Scripture that was similar to what you just discussed. Then have them complete the activity. Ask students to share their responses when they are finished. Use the answer key to guide discussion.



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- D. Explain that each one of them was created in God's image and this means they are loved and created to share in God's love. All of God's creation is good. Our bodies are part of God's creation! God made every part of their body, and every part of their body is good. Their body is a precious part of who they are. God loves them, and He loves their body. We should love and care for our own bodies the way God would want us to—with love.
- **E.** Finally, distribute the <u>Self Portrait</u> worksheet, and make crayons, markers and/or colored pencils available to your students to complete the activity.
- F. Circulate around the room admiring students' work. Say each students name, and remind them they are a son or daughter of God. For example, "That's a beautiful drawing. Jane, you are a wonderful daughter of God."
